

Fear - it's a very real part of everyday life for many people around the world, but this is especially true for a tribal person living in the Pacific island nation of Papua New Guinea (PNG). In their belief system, the spirits of their ancestors occupy the rivers, trees and the world that surrounds them, controlling what happens in the physical world, both for good and for evil. They believe if the spirits are not happy they must be appeased through sacrifices or rituals. Immoral living, idolatry, animal sacrifices, even the killing of their own people is all done in the hopes of keeping the spirits at bay. Life after life is lost in this vicious cycle of bloodshed and death.



The cycle can and is being broken! Missionaries and national believers are actively telling those living in fear there of the freedom to be found in the name of Jesus Christ. **They are using the 40-event chronological overview of the Bible called** *The Story of Hope* **with tremendous results!** Here are just two accounts from missionary Bill Smith of how the Lord is blessing the use of Good Soil materials there with Papua New Guinea nationals:

Twenty-three leaders of the First Baptist Church Español of Elkhart, Indiana completed the Good Soil Basic course in Spanish, including the pastor. Carl Sexton and Mike Tabor, both veteran ABWE



missionaries to Spanish-speaking countries, partnered up to deliver the quality teaching for this monumental endeavor.

The Elkhart Spanish congregation will soon begin studying through The Story of Hope with 100 Hispanic adults and 30 teens. These dear people are absolutely elated about using the Good Soil materials as well as training their people to share God's plan of redemption with their non-Christian family and friends. But that's not all! The pastors of the English congregation have caught wind of the enthusiasm in the Hispanic congregation and are now interested in using the Good Soil material with their folks, too! 
