



Today we contrast faithfulness with **idolatry** (a work of the flesh in Galatians 5:20). Observe people's behavior— **faithful** or **idolatrous**.

**Before we read the story of Exodus 32, let's remember a few points of historic background.**



**Let's read Exodus 32:1-10.**

Why was God so upset with the people? Do you think He was justified in His anger? Why?

Notice the difference between Moses' response in verses 11-13 and his response in verses 19-20 and 25-27. What made the difference?

Why did Moses change his mind?

**The sin of idolatry is serious. Many people died.**

Remember that idolatry is one of the works of the flesh (Galatians 5:18-20).



What does idolatry look like in your part of the world? Read Ephesians 5:16, also, as you answer this question.



Ask God to help you remain **faithful**, cultivating the fruit of the Spirit, and not allowing **idolatry** to sidetrack you in anyway.
